Secret gardens, water gardens, exquisite features, woodlands and labours of true love will delight and impress garden appreciators.



Hellens Manor

One of the oldest dwellings in England dating to the Domesday Book, the impressive house sits within romantic gardens, inc a rare 17^o octagonal dovecot, physic garden, labyrinth, woodland and more.



Hergest Croft Gardens

Over 70 acres of gardens with over 5000 rare trees and shrubs, considered to be one of the finest collections in the British Isles. There is a café too with delicious homemade food



Brobury House and Gardens

Open 12 months of the year. Enjoy tranquillity through the seasons, terraced on the banks of the River Wye with vistas of the surrounding countryside.



Rhodds Farm Garden

Cleverly designed by the owner, enjoy the dovecot, large areas of perennials, wild-flower meadows, hot borders, a gravel garden, formal garden and 3 ponds, plus 13 acres of woodland.



Hampton Court Castle

Stroll along the river walk or revel in the symmetry of the Dutch garden, rose gardens, abundant kitchen garden and sunken pools. Walk under the exotic water garden and play in the maze of 1000 yew trees.



Westonbury Mill Water Gardens

Home to the largest water-powered cuckoo clock in England, follies, a glass dome made from 5000 bottles and vivid colourful plants, across 3 acres of streams and ponds.



Stockton Bury Gardens

40 years of artistic flair has created these family owned gardens to inspire any enthusiast. Take in the view from the secret garden or explore the newly planted pillar garden.



Kentchurch Court

The Scudamore seat for 1000 years. Stroll through the rhododendron wood or explore the walled garden with its traditional planting, the rose covered 14C arch or discover the deer park.



The Laskett Gardens

The largest private formal garden in England, created over 40 years by Sir Roy Strong and his late wife, now belongs to Perennial. Relax in this story telling garden.



Hereford Cathedral

Six acres of tranquil gardens reflecting ecclesiastical and medicinal themes in the College Garden, along with beautiful views of the River Wye and Cathedral.

NB: All locations except The Laskett Gardens have tearooms/cafes. Picnics are welcomed.

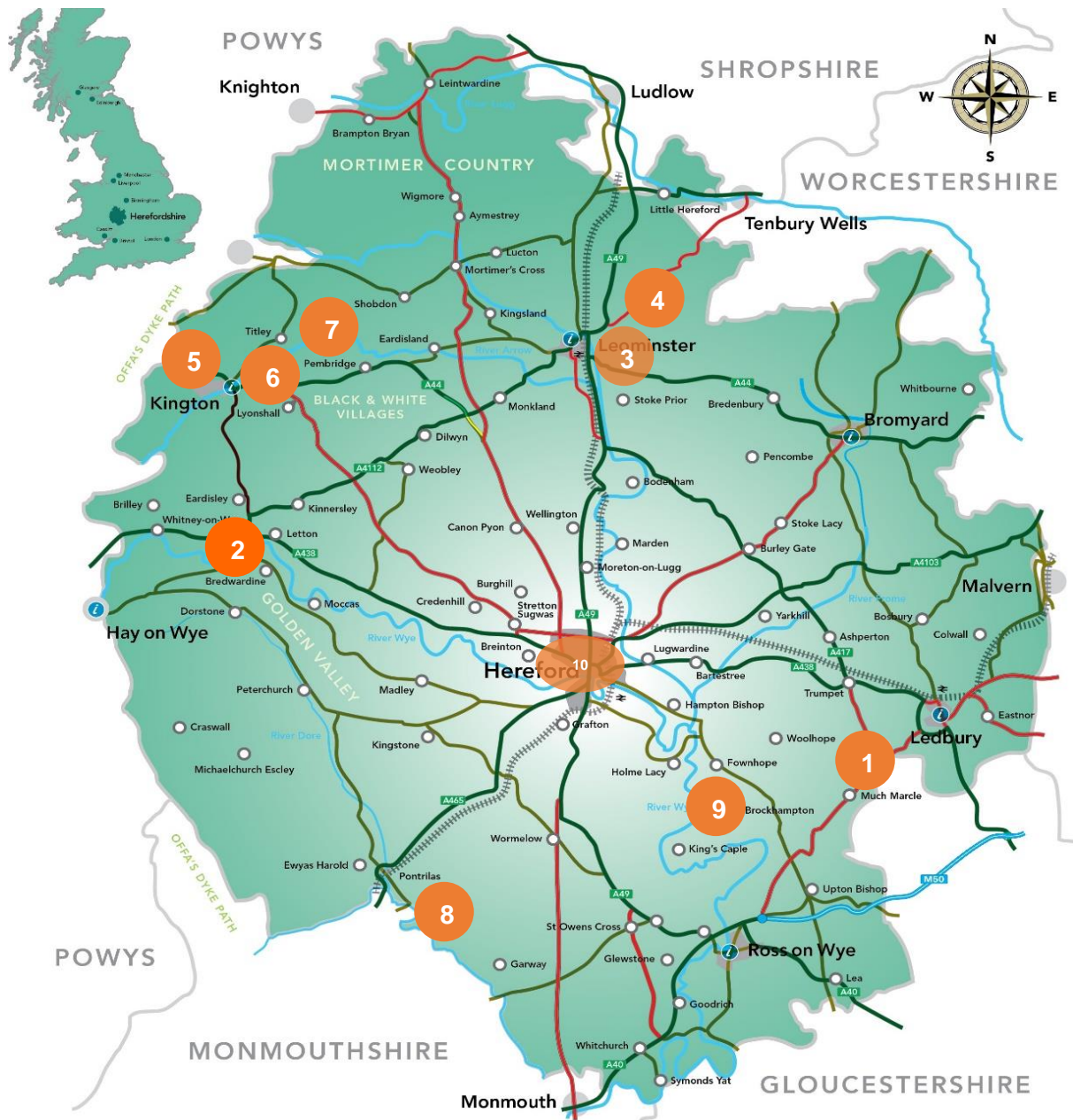
